The *Blueprint for Timboon* community plan was developed through the latter half of 2011, through a town survey (which received 136 returns) and a public meeting (attended by 75 people) on 24 November 2011, where 21 township priorities were settled upon.

In addition to this list of priority actions, the planning process discovered a list of attributes which Timboon and district residents most valued about their town. Timboon's outstanding natural assets headed this list by a large margin, followed by the township's businesses and shops, medical and health services, sporting clubs and the Timboon P-12 School. The friendly nature of the township community also came in for mention.

As with a number of other community plans, some of the key community aspirations identified demanded the formulation of a more detailed plan of actions in order to influence the primary issue raised. So it was with the plea which formed the town's top priority - 'More shops, fill empty shops'. Having regard to the attributes most valued by the community, the Survey Taskforce formulated a Vision for the *Blueprint* plan. This referred to the diversification of the town's economy and the enhancement of Timboon's 'brand' – built around the natural environment, local produce, tourism and retail, as well as the health and education services and recreational opportunities which make Timboon a sought after residential and commercial address.



The Survey Taskforce identified a program of 13 project elements focused around improving the presentation and amenity of Timboon historic heart – the Railway Park Precinct. This place-making approach secured a State government grant of \$70,000 to match the Shire's initial investment, and was augmented by private funding from BHP Billiton and Timboon Action fund-raising. Other contributions by Council (the public art project and refurbishment of the public toilets) resulted in the delivery of a \$250,000 project which has transformed the town centre, upgraded recreational and social amenities, improved pedestrian connectivity and strengthened connections to the retail centre and other services. It would be wrong to claim a causal connection, yet the project has realised its intended outcomes of attracting new retail investment and strengthening Timboon's brand identity.

Of the 49 actions identified in the original Blueprint for Timboon plan, 16 have been completed and a further 13 are underway. These projects in train include the longawaited construction project to upgrade facilities at the Timboon P-12 School, the commencement of planning for the Town Centre Improvements Project to be executed in 2015/16, footpath proposals and work on development of the extension to the Craters to Coast Trail. Five of the 21 priorities have effectively been completed, and a good third of the items on the list are effectively 'parked', awaiting developments or opportunities to be prioritised for action. Some are 'parked' with other agencies which have responsibility for their design and implementation. (See list on the following page.)

There have been three public meetings held to review the Blueprint for Timboon. The first was held on 26 November 2014, however due to unforeseen circumstances a number of attendees were unable to attend. The small but enthusiastic audience of 18 people was insufficient to justify reordering priorities set by the 158 people involved in the shaping of the original plan. Meetings of Timboon Action involving a similar number of people and the Town Walk meeting held on 13 January 2015 (37 people surveyed and 27 people in attendance) contributed views on new priorities for the Plan. Another public meeting to review and update the Blueprint was held on held on 25 February 2015, and it drew 41

attendees, including 19 people who were participating for the first time. In all, an estimated 60 to 70 people have been involved in the *Blueprint* review exercise.

Two new priorities have been added – the construction of a mountain bike trail in bushland adjoining Cowley's Creek and the proposal to better support Timboon Action. The other five priorities derive from the original Blueprint plan, either as activation of dormant projects or as responses to issues identified previously. The adjacent list assigns priorities with reference to original and current voting numbers, although this is immaterial as all projects will all be pursued simultaneously. (The Food Trail Map project carries over from the original plan.)

At the conclusion of the review meeting held on 25 February 2015 seven Action Groups were formed, varying in membership from two to 12 people. (Opportunities will be provided for others to join these groups.) In pursuit of the objective to better support Timboon Action, the Action Groups are to meet between Timboon Action's monthly meetings to report their progress and to obtain advice and support on project planning and implementation.

The **Town Centre Improvements** project will be led by the community but facilitated by the Shire. (Indicative funding of \$300K is subject to Council's annual budgetary process.)

An enthusiastic group of cyclists will prosecute the **Mountain Bike Trail** project, which is proposed to connect to the Rail Trail extension at Glerum's Road).

Both the **Story of Timboon** and the **Publication on local features and events** arise from the original Blueprint plan of three years ago. Options have been outlined as to the form these projects could take.

There is a community aspiration to develop new **Town Entry Signage** for Timboon, with a view that the previous effort falls short on visual impact. An opportunity exists to work with Vicroads on **Review of all Signage**, and the proposed installation of a **RV/Caravan dump point** will connect to a broader dialogue concerning tourism infrastructure across the Shire.
