IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT OBJECTIONS TO PERMIT APPLICATIONS

- 1. Make sure you clearly understand what is proposed before you make an objection. You can inspect the application at the Responsible Authority's office or on Council's website, www.corangamite.vic.gov.au.
- 2. To ensure the Responsible Authority considers your objection, make sure that the Authority receives it by the date shown on the Notice of Application you were sent; saw in a newspaper or on the site.
- 3. The Responsible Authority must make a copy of every objection available at its office for any person to inspect during office hours free of charge until the end of the period which an application may be made for review of a decision on the application. A copy of your objection, including your name and address (but not your personal contact details) will be made available to the applicant.
- 4. The Responsible Authority may reject an objection which it considers has been made primarily to secure or maintain a direct or indirect commercial advantage for the objector. If this is case, the Act applies as if the objection had not been made.
- 5. If your objection relates to an effect on property other than at your address as shown on this form, give details of that property and your interest in it.
- 6. If a number of persons make one objection, they may give the Responsible Authority the name and address of a person to whom the Authority can contact and give notice of the decision. If no single contact name and address is provided, the Authority will send all correspondence and notice of its decision to the first person listed.
- 7. If you do object before the Responsible Authority makes a decision, the Authority will tell you its decision.
- 8. If despite your objection, the Responsible Authority decides to grant the permit, you can appeal against the decision. Details of the appeal procedures are set out on the back of the Notice of Decision which you will receive. An appeal must be made on a prescribed form (obtainable from the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal) and accompanied by the prescribed fee. A copy must be forwarded to the Responsible Authority. The closing date for appeals is 21 days after the Responsible Authority gives notice of its decision.
